Sat. April 6, 11-12

Classroom A: Terry Moss will share his process for laying out a woodcarving project on a block of wood and preparing it as a bandsaw cutout.

Classroom B: Donna Cereghino and Barb Fromherz will demonstrate everything you need to know from how to work the machine to the actual step-by-step process of woodburning.

Sat. April 6, 1-2

Classroom A: Don Fromherz will host a hands-on chip carving. He promises something for everyone.

Classroom B: Everett Carter will demonstrate sharpening and tool care; specifically, how and why you should protect your cutting edge, plus how to use stones and strops.

Sun. April 7, 11-12

Classroom A: Cheryl Ayres will host a hands-on demo using power carving and /or hand carving on how to make realistic hair on your realistic animals or caricature carvings. She will provide study sticks. Bring your tools.

Cherry told us how it all started for her about seven years ago when her brother, who was getting into wood carving, asked her if she wanted to try it, she said. "He taught me how to make cuts and from the first cut I was hooked; it was the most joyous experience."

Cherry's style of relief carving includes the

removal and replacement of the background with stained glass. What a great presentation, thank you Cherry.


